Advocacy Win!

On 11/8, the House Committee on Foreign Affairs voted on HR 4175 (REPO Act) and H. Res. 149 (child deportation resolution) during their committee makeup. They passed, meaning they can now be brought to the House floor by the Speaker for a vote.

Impacts on Legislation

Legislation Guide

Genocide Resolution H.Res.154/S.Res.72

A majority of Americans say that Russia is attempting genocide in Ukraine, and legal experts around the world agree. Recognizing this atrocity signals to Russia that it will be held accountable and that Ukrainians will find justice.

Rebuilding Economic Prosperity for Ukrainians (REPO) Act H.R.4175/S.2003

This bill confirms existing authority to use frozen Russian state assets in the United States for reconstructing Ukraine. The passage of REPO will encourage our global partners to take similar approaches, tapping into over \$300B+ of Russian central bank reserves frozen by allies.

Ukraine Victory Resolution H.Res.332/S.Res.172

The Ukraine Victory Resolution is the first legislation to make clear that the U.S. goal is to help Ukraine win, and reaffirms our commitment to help Ukraine secure its internationally recognized 1991 borders.

Forced Transfer of Children H.Res.149/S.Res.158

Russia has kidnapped tens of thousands of Ukrainian children, detaining them in a network of dozens of camps across occupied territory, Russia, and Belarus. Congress must condemn this crime against humanity.



Local Ukraine Advocacy Ideas

Our work doesn't stop here! Check out these ideas for further advocacy to keep the momentum of the Summit going.



Contact Your Represenative by Phone, Email, Social Media & Snail Mail Let your representative know what issues are important to you, and ask them to cosponsor bills and support funding for Ukraine.

Connect With Local Communities. Collaborate. Invite your Representative.

Find allies in your community that you can advocate together with. Build a network of Ukraine supporters. Host cultural and advocacy events like holiday celebrations, fundraisers, commemorations, vigils, and protests. Invite your representative, and invite your local media. Take photos and share on social media.

Stay Connected

Join the Ukraine Action Summit Alumni Signal chat to keep the conversation going with your fellow advocates around the country. Check the post-Summit email for the link.

Think Local

Get your local municipal authorities involved. Look into getting your city or town to issue a proclomation related to Ukraine. Display a Ukrainian flag outside your home, business, on your vehicle, or on your social media profiles. Remind people this war is ongoing and we need their continued support.


Make Noise in Media





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There's already a big appetite for prioritizing this funding among members of Congress. In recent days, hundreds of constituents from around the country traveled to Washington to push Congress to pass this supplemental package; this took place as part of the Ukraine Action Summit, which my organization, Razom for Ukraine, helped to organize. If you work on Capitol Hill, you probably saw hundreds of constituents meeting with offices to advocate for this funding.

In meeting after meeting, constituents found that most members of Congress get it: support for Ukraine remains largely bipartisan, and members of Congress want to act. President Joe Biden's recent Oval Office address, his first on Ukraine, clearly laid out why this issue matters to Americans, and made a compelling case to Congress. "If we walk away and let Putin erase Ukraine's independence," Biden told the nation, "would-be aggressors around the world would be emboldened to try the same."

Scott Cullinane, director of government affairs at Razom, an NGO advocating for Ukraine that recently hosted a summit with lawmakers in Congress, said, "there is a sense among some Republican members in particular that the U.S. is carrying the burden alone — and that's very much not the case. By various metrics, European allies are doing as much, or even more in some senses, than we are in terms of the provision of military equipment and in terms of bearing the cost of imposing sanctions."
